PEST FEATURE LOVEBUGS

Lovebugs, *Plecia nearctica*, are members of the bibionid fly family and are sometimes referred to as March flies because of their appearance in the spring time around the month of March. Lovebugs get their name because they are often found in mating pairs. Despite rumors, these are native to the United States and were not an escaped laboratory experiment gone wrong.

The adult flies are small, black, and velvety with red on the top of the thorax. They lay their eggs on the soil surface under decaying vegetation. Larvae require adequate moisture, decayed vegetation for food, and warm soil temperatures. Pupation occurs on top of the soil and lasts seven to nine days.

The flies emerge often in large numbers and can be a significant nuisance. They are attracted to highways and will spatter on the hood and windshield of cars. This can reduce visibility causing unsafe driving conditions. Additionally, the body fluids are slightly acidic and are able to etch automobile paint. To prevent damage, do not allow them to remain on the vehicle more than several days. Wash them off by soaking for five minutes followed by scrubbing within 15-20 minutes.

THE IMPORTANCE OF READING THE LABEL

A pesticide label is most important way a manufacturer communicates with the consumer. The pesticide label tells the consumer the active ingredients, how to use the pesticide safely and effectively, how to store the product, how to provide first aid, how to dispose of the product, and much more. Following the label's instructions **is the law**.

Before purchasing the pesticide, read the label to make sure your target pest is listed on the label. Find the product that will assist you in solving the pest problem. Each product is extensively tested to find the rate of use and target pests. The label tells the consumer at what rate and how to apply the pesticide. Off label use is illegal and is often ineffective.

Pay special attention to the warnings and personal protective clothing and equipment listed for use. Follow all directions in order to protect the user from exposure while applying the pesticide. The label lists the type of clothing and other protective gear that is mandated for use. It is the responsibility of the employer to provide the personal protective equipment listed on the label. The goal is to keep everyone safe from



pesticide exposure and to use the pesticide in an effective manner. For more information about pesticide labels, visit the Environmental Protection Agency's pesticide label website at www.epa.gov/pesticide-labels.
